During the 2019-2020 school year, up until March we were able to deliver in school programming through our traditional methods. In that time frame through *Discovering Skills*, we delievered **147 presentations at 90 different schools** in the province **reaching 5,522 students**. With our Essential Skills Program, we managed to deliver **102 presentations at 45 different schools reaching 2,836 students**. Our programming was also able to reach more underrepresented communities, engaging with **1,299 students with a disability**, **1,950 students that identify as a visible minority**, and **1,009 indigenous youth**.
